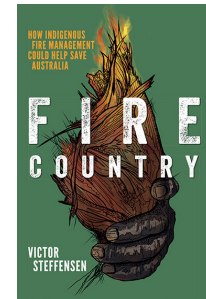


## **We Were the Lucky Ones**

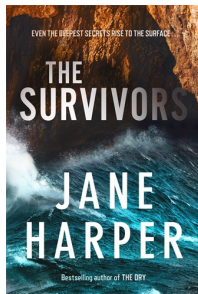


## **The Things She Owned**
